Landmarks

Emblems are signs or symbols visible to the eye, which stands for something in addition to themselves, and they create in the mind a flow of thought. The square for instance, in all ages has been symbol of Masonry, but it's use has become so common that "to be on the square" has a meaning to others than Masons.

Allegories are parables. In seeking why Masonry is taught in allegories instead of by logical statements of truth in direct form, we may answer that in many ages truth has been taught by allegories and parables, in order that the mind may conceive great and fundamental truths in comparison with simple things.

Masonry is indeed ancient and we may trace four ideas in this peculiar system through many ages. These four principle ideas might even be called Landmarks. They are: a belief in one God, a teaching of Immortality, a symbolic idea of building and a seeking after something which was lost.
